

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Office of Transportation Delivery

Office of Transportation Delivery

The Office of Transportation Delivery, comprising two branches, is responsible for seeking grant funds; overseeing and implementing various statewide public transit grants; and coordinating human service transportation, such as non-emergency medical transportation.

Transportation grants offer general public transit services and assist in the mobility for the elderly, low income, and persons with disabilities.

Human Service Transportation Delivery Branch (HSTD)

The Human Service Transportation Delivery Branch is responsible for the oversight of the Human Service Transportation Delivery (HSTD) program. The HSTD program consolidates transportation services previously provided by various state governmental agencies. The former transportation delivery process was fragmented, increasingly costly, and vulnerable to fraud and abuse. In addition, transportation services were not easily accessible in some rural areas.

Under the HSTD program, transportation services for the Department for Medicaid Services, Department for the Blind, and the Department of Vocational Rehabilitation are now coordinated by the Kentucky Transportation Cabinet, Office of Transportation Delivery.

Kentucky Public Transit Branch

The Kentucky Public Transit Branch distributes and oversees grants, including operating, capital (rolling stock and transit facilities), and technical assistance. These grants are administered directly by statewide nonprofit or public operators. Statewide, operators vary from a one county rural operation to multiple county systems to large urban area transit agencies. The Public Transit Branch oversees Section 5311, 5310, and some small 5307 public transit agencies.

HSTD Facts:

- The State of Kentucky is divided into 15 HSTD regions Regional brokers, who were awarded a contract under a competitive bid process, administer each region.
- The HSTD program provides nearly 3.6 million one way trips each year to Kentucky's Medicaid, Department for the Blind, and Vocational Rehabilitation recipients.
- Drivers under the HSTD program are subject to pre-employment and random drug testing as well as criminal and driving record checks.
- Drivers are required to complete First Aid, and passenger assistance training prior to transporting HSTD recipients.
- Vehicles used to transport recipients under the HSTD program are inspected to ensure that they are safe, properly equipped and meet State and Federal laws and regulations.
- Broker assessments and rider surveys are conducted to ensure efficient and safe transportation practices are in place and exercised.

Public Transportation Facts:

- The USDOT Federal Transit Administration recognizes Kentucky as having one of the best-administered State grant systems in the United States.
- In FFY 2019 over 78 million dollars in transit funds will be secured for needed transportation services and capital to assist Kentuckians to jobs, medical facilities, to education, recreation etc.
- Over twenty five million trips are provided annually by Kentucky's public transportation systems.
- Every county in Kentucky is covered by a specialized or general public transportation system.
- Kentucky has increased the number of transfer stations, bus facility waiting areas and bus stop shelters.
- Each transit system has their own individual rate structure.

HSTD Services

Who is eligible?

Medicaid, Department for the Blind, and Vocational Rehabilitation recipients are transported by the Human Service Delivery Program.

What region do I live in?

Find your region, then call the broker number for transportation services in your area.

How does it work?

Recipients needing to schedule transportation services should contact their regional broker during their normal office hours of Monday - Friday from 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. and Saturday from 8:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. local time. After hours, paging is available 24/7 including holidays.

Brokers provide transportation services between 6:00 am and 8:00 pm Monday through Friday and between 8:00 am and 1:00 pm on Saturdays. Urgent Care transportation is available twenty-four hours a day, seven days a week.

Please schedule at least 72 hours in advance. If you have to cancel your appointment, call your broker.

Section 5303, 5304, 5307, 5310, 5311 & 5339 Transit Grant Programs

Descriptions of 5303, 5304, 5307, 5310 5311, and 5339 Transit Grant Programs

5303 Metropolitan Planning

This program provides funding to support cooperative, continuous, and comprehensive planning for making transportation investment decisions in metropolitan areas.

Eligible Recipients

State Departments of Transportation (DOTs) and Metropolitan Planning Organizations (MPOs). Federal planning funds are first apportioned to State DOTs. State DOTs then allocate planning funding to MPOs.

Eligible Activities

Funds are available for planning activities that (A) support the economic vitality of the metropolitan area, especially by enabling global competitiveness, productivity, and efficiency; (B) increase the safety of the transportation system for motorized and non motorized users; (C) increase the security of the transportation system for motorized and non motorized users; (D) increase the accessibility and mobility of people and for freight; (E) protect and enhance the environment, promote energy conservation, improve the quality of life, and promote consistency between transportation improvements and State and local planned growth and economic development patterns; (F) enhance the integration and connectivity of the transportation system, across and between modes, for people and freight; (G) promote efficient system management and operation; and (H) emphasize the preservation of the existing transportation system.

Major new fixed guideway projects, or extension to existing systems financed with New Starts funds, typically receive these funds through a full funding grant agreement that defines the scope of the project and specifies the total multi-year Federal commitment to the project.

5304 Statewide Planning

This program provides funding to support cooperative, continuous, and comprehensive planning for making transportation investment decisions statewide.

Eligible Recipients

State Departments of Transportation (DOTs) and Metropolitan Planning Organizations (MPOs). Federal planning funds are first apportioned to State DOTs. State DOTs then allocate planning funding to MPOs.

Eligible Activities

Funds are available for planning activities that (A) support the economic vitality of the metropolitan area, especially by enabling global competitiveness, productivity, and efficiency; (B) increase the safety of the transportation system for motorized and nonmotorized users; (C) increase the security of the transportation system for motorized and nonmotorized users; (D) increase the accessibility and mobility of people and for freight; (E) protect and enhance the environment, promote energy conservation, improve the quality of life, and promote consistency between transportation improvements and State and local planned growth and economic development patterns; (F) enhance the integration and connectivity of the transportation system, across and between modes, for people and freight; (G) promote efficient system management and operation; and (H) emphasize the preservation of the existing transportation system.

Major new fixed guideway projects, or extension to existing systems financed with New Starts funds, typically receive these funds through a full funding grant agreement that defines the scope of the project and specifies the total multi-year Federal commitment to the project.

5307 Urbanized Area Formula Grant

The Urbanized Area Formula Funding program (49 U.S.C. 5307) makes federal resources available to urbanized areas and to governors for transit capital and operating assistance in urbanized areas and for transportation-related planning. An urbanized area is an incorporated area with a population of 50,000 or more that is designated as such by the U.S. Department of Commerce, Bureau of the Census.

Eligible Recipients

Funding is made available to designated recipients that are public bodies with the legal authority to receive and dispense federal funds. Governors, responsible local officials and publicly owned operators of transit services shall designate a recipient to apply for, receive, and dispense funds for urbanized areas pursuant to 49USCA5307(a)(2). The governor or governor's designee acts as the designated recipient for urbanized areas between 50,000 and 200,000. For urbanized areas with 200,000 in population and over, funds are apportioned and flow directly to a designated recipient selected locally to apply for and receive Federal funds. For urbanized areas under 200,000 in population, the funds are apportioned to the governor of each state for distribution.

Eligible Activities

Eligible activities include: planning, engineering, design and evaluation of transit projects and other technical transportation-related studies; capital investments in bus and bus-related activities such as replacement, overhaul and rebuilding of buses, crime prevention and security equipment and construction of maintenance and passenger facilities; and capital investments in new and existing fixed guideway systems including rolling stock, overhaul and rebuilding of vehicles, track, signals, communications, and computer hardware and software. In addition, associated transit improvements and certain expenses associated

with mobility management programs are eligible under the program. All preventive maintenance and some Americans with Disabilities Act complementary paratransit service costs are considered capital costs.

For urbanized areas with populations less than 200,000, operating assistance is an eligible expense. Urbanized areas of 200,000 or more may not use funds for operating assistance unless identified by FTA as eligible under the Special Rule.

5310 Elderly Individuals and Individuals with Disabilities Program

The 5310 program assist private or designated public nonprofit agencies in meeting the transportation needs of older adults and people with disabilities. The Office of Transportation Delivery, through the Section 5310 program, provides funds to private nonprofit entities, public bodies approved by the state to coordinate transportation services for older adults and people with disabilities, or public bodies which certify to the Governor that no private nonprofit entity or association is readily available in an area to provide the service.

Federal financial assistance under the Section 5310 program is limited to participation in the cost of capital equipment (rolling stock), cost for purchase of transportation service contract(s), mobility management, and state-level administrative costs to administer the program.

The goal of the Section 5310 program is to improve mobility for older adults and people with disabilities throughout the state and to enhance coordination of federally assisted programs and services in order to encourage the most efficient use of federal resources and achieve the national goal of improved mobility of elderly persons and persons with disabilities. In Kentucky both private and public nonprofit agencies are encouraged to coordinate transportation services with agencies that provide transportation services to the public. KYTC / OTD is the designated recipient for urban and rural areas of the State. A fully Coordinated Plan is required.

5311 Non-Urbanized (Rural) Area Program

The 5311 program is intended to provide financial assistance for the support of public transportation services, which are open to the public on an equal basis in areas outside of an urbanized area of less than 50,000 population.

The 5311 funds can be used for the costs of transit planning activities, transit operations and purchase of capital equipment or facilities to aid in provision of transit services in rural and small urban areas, as well as provide funds for state-level administration. Federal regulation requires that 15% percentage of these funds be reserved each year to support an Intercity Bus Program, unless the Governor of a state certifies that intercity bus needs in the state are being met.

Through the Section 5311 Program, the Office of Transportation Delivery provides administrative, operating and capital assistance to public transportation projects in nonurbanized (rural) areas. The program goals are:

5339 Bus and Bus Facilities Program

The Federal Transit Administration (FTA) Bus and Bus Facilities Program provides capital funding to replace, rehabilitate and purchase buses and related equipment and to construct bus related facilities. The new formula grant program was established under Section 5339, replacing the previous Section 5309 discretionary Capital Investment program. This is a formula program and must be applied for through the Office of Transportation Delivery for rural (<50,000) and small urbanized areas (<200,000). FTA requires an 80/20 Federal/Local match for this program.
