If your agency serves the elderly and handicapped and was recommended for approval for capital equipment under FY 1992 cycle of the Section 16(b)2 Elderly and Handicapped Program, we want to remind you that the full application is due in the Division's office no later than September 30, 1991. 128 requests were received; only 23 new vehicles and 19 vehicle rehabilitations are recommended due to funding limitations.

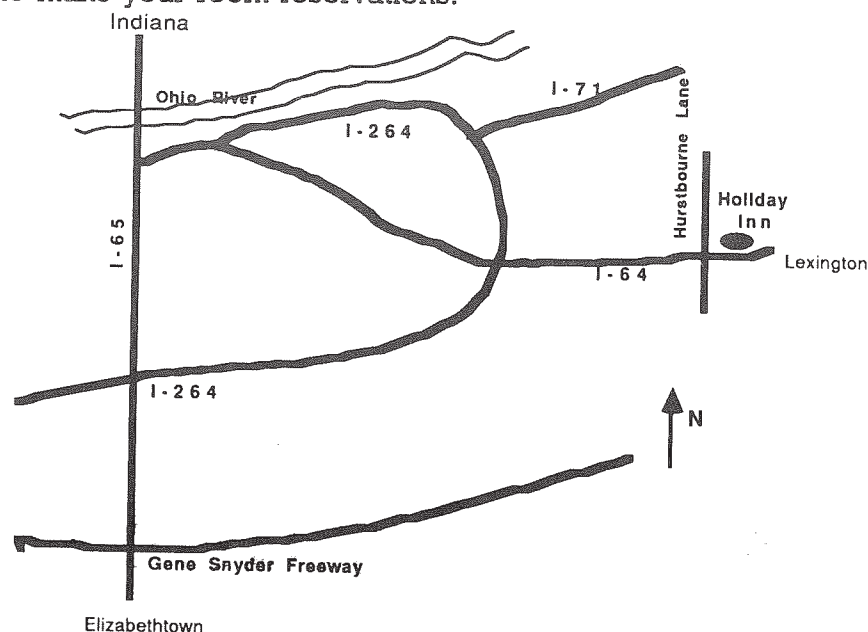
FROM THE PRESIDENT'S DESK

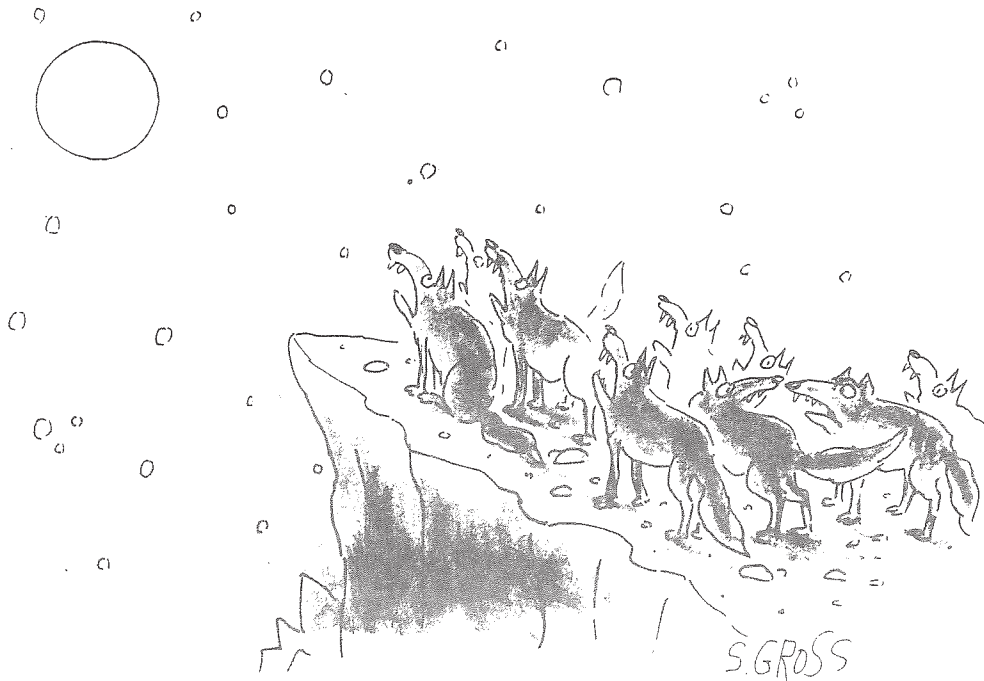
